Native Groundcover

Groundcovers are typically a mixture of low-lying plants that are easy to grow, are native to the area and require little maintenance. Groundcovers offer many advantages compared to typical grass lawns such as:

- Less need to water and mow
- Protection of soil from erosion
- Increased drought, shade and sun tolerance
- Food and shelter for wildlife
- Decreased stormwater runoff

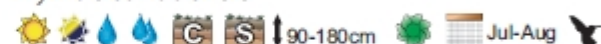

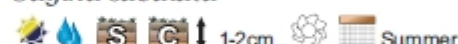

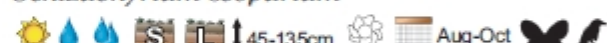
